Who Should Attend: Police and Fire personnel who want to establish a professional drone program within their department and departments that are already using drones and are thinking about applying for Certificates of Waiver or Authorization (COA) for Public Use.

Instructors: Sergeant Patrick Moody and Patrol Officer Michael Allard both hold Part 107 Remote Pilot Licenses and Part 61 Pilot Licenses. Sergeant Moody and Officer Allard have established a Small Unmanned Aircraft Systems (sUAS) unit with the Northampton Police Department which has 5 licensed Remote Pilots and two drones (Inspire 1v.2 and Phantom 4). They independently completed the Public Use COA and were granted the COA with no errors. The COA grants the members of the unit special privileges which include night time flight and flight over crowds in Hampshire County.
